Meet Sidney

Sidney Pratt is a former Open Door School student who has been receiveing services from Lawrence County DD since she was a child. She is currently enrolled in LCDD's Service and Support program.

In 2015, Sidney began recieving a SELF Waiver, which stands for Self-Empowered Life Funding Waiver. The SELF Waiver is a good fit for people who want to be in charge of some of their services.

With the waiver coordinated for her through LCDD, Sidney has been able to utilize it for horse riding, an iPad to video chat with friends to keep her included, the purchase of a van modification for ramps for safe travel, a renovation of her bathroom with a bigger tub and a lift, and more accessible walkways for her home.

Sidney has become more vocal about her wants and needs and how she makes decisions in recent years. Currently, Sidney and her family are trying set up a

situation in which Sidney would have a provider.

"I think that will give her some independence," says Sidney's mother. "Not everything has to be done through mom - I think that's important the older she gets."

With the help of LCDD's services, Sidney will soon be living a life of indepence, being able to make the choices that she wants and feels are best for her.



Key Accomplishments in 2019

Reduced the operational budget by over 2 million dollars over the past two years due to organizational restructuring, partnerships with other organizations, and other cost savings measures.

Increased the availability of technology for all areas of the program to increase efficiency and enhance service provision for individuals served.

Through a partnership with the Community Action Organization and the Ohio Department of DD, secured funding for new housing development for individuals with developmental disabilities.

Reduced our Medicaid Waiver waiting list by securing limited, state-funded, Medicaid Waivers from the Ohio Department of DD for individuals with immediate needs.






