PALS's primary focus is to create an overall active and engaging environment in which individuals are in constant movement engaging in activities of their choice while gaining physical wellness and daily living skills in doing so.

"Our goal is to create unimaginable opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities, our mission is their success! We truly do live that mission day to day in our supports." Says Mike Pierro, representative from PALS. "We are a provider who is not afraid to engage in the community, taking a creative and progress approach to our day to day supports. Our groups have engaged in activities such as rock climbing, zip lining, group camps, college enrollment, and habilitation of vocational skills inside of community businesses that all lead to an overall increased quality of life."

PALS has been selected as a provider for the DODD Transformation Summit for numerous years as a model provider for DODD's mission of community engagement and supports.

Lawrence County's branch has a sibling program in Gallia County, where PALS was awarded the opportunity to privatize GallCo Industries and transform the former sheltered workshop into a community based program.

Some examples of what the Gallia program has brought to the local community are:

Mowing and landscaping contracts with local businesses. Adopt a block programs. Giving/Sharing boxes posted throughout the local community. Hunger drives for the community A park created and maintained by individuals supported by PALS. Employment and vocational opportunities at local businesses.
