EARLY INTERVENTION

Early Intervention is a statewide system that provides coordinated services for children from birth to 3 years old with a disability or a delay.

A specialized team works with the family during the child's development to enhance learning and reach goals.

HOW IT WORKS!

Step 1

A family will be visited by a Service Coordinator from Lawrence County Developmental Disabilities to begin the process and explain the Parents Rights and program.

Step 2

An Evaluation Team is assigned and a comprehensive evaluation is completed on your child.

Step 3

If your child qualifies for EI services, a Service Coordinator will arrange all services the child needs along with maintaining all records.

A Primary Service Provider (PSP) will visit you on a regular basis - either face-to-face, on the phone or virtually - providing you with coaching to promote your child's development. The PSP will complete ongoing evaluations and assessments.

Your child may also receive bursts of services from a therapist, as needed. These include speech, physical and occupational therapies.



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The Evaluation Team

In order to assess your child's needs, the evaluation team consists of several members of the Early Intervention Core Team.

These positions include:

Service Coordinator Developmental Specialist
Occupational Therapist Physical Therapist
Speech Therapist Nurse

Therapy services are provided in bursts and as needed

The Evaluation

During the evaluation process, five domains are assessed to determine if your child qualifies for Early Intervention services. Those criteria are:

- Communication • Gross Motor Skills • Fine Motor Skills • Personal/Social Behaviors • Problem Solving Skills

Early Intervention is designed to work with families in the area of delay with their child.

Our goal is to help families enhance a child's learning and development through every-day routines with which the child is familiar.
