### **Team MAP: Preparing for Life After School**

Team MAP, or Multi Agency Planning, is an approach to providing services to students transitioning from high school into adulthood. Team MAP focuses on developing a strategic and measurable plan to improve the local capacity to serve transition age youth and to extend and sustain multi agency planning practices.

LCDD is in its second year of partnering with Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD), local school districts, and the State Support Team Region15 to form a core team with the purpose of supporting youth to have meaningful transition services. Key components of our plan include: improving the knowledge of community resources; increasing communication between local school districts, LCDD, and OOD; hosting training sessions and working together to develop a comprehensive transition plan for students starting at a younger age; and focusing on engaging students and families in the transition process.

Here in Lawrence County our Team MAP started out as the Lawrence County Transition Network and has now evolved into the Employment Resource Alliance (ERA) with the vision that youth, families, and community partners will

have a clear and cohesive path to successful, competitive, integrated employment. We are just getting started on our journey and are excited to see what's yet to come for transition age youth in Lawrence County! #### Funding Our Services: What's a Waiver?

Waiver services are intended to help people with DD engage in community life. Waivers are federal funds and are one way to pay for services that help people with developmental disabilities live their lives.

The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities administers three different types of waivers. The Individual Options, Level One, and Self-Empowered Life Funding (SELF) waivers each have different spending limits and offer different types of services.

Lawrence County Developmental Disabilities must contribute approximately 40% of the funding for these services. As of 2018, Lawrence County had 244 people receiving waiver funding, with more on a waiting list. These services paid for by LCDD and federal and local funds help to bring in jobs and dollars to Lawrence County. In 2018, over 9 million dollars was paid to local independent providers and provider agencies for services provided to people with DD in our county.

LCDD is currently gathering information and working to shape the future of services in Lawrence County by shortening the waiting list and expanding waiver funding, continuing to lead the way for DD services for people in our area.
