### **Superintendent's Corner**



It is an exciting time to be a part of LCDD! Our new school location has worked out beautifully, and the students and staff have settled in well. It was very nice to see so many people come together this summer to make the move possible. Jeff Townsend, Facilities Operations Coordinator

for LCDD, headed up the renovations and relocation of the school. There were also several staff members, and others who volunteered to assure the building was ready on time. It is also very nice to now have a large area for trainings, gatherings, and other special events in the new school gymnasium.

While our school services provide a valuable service to students in Lawrence County, it is important that we continue to provide information about the total array of services provided by LCDD. Our Service and Support Administration (SSA) services, for example, assists eligible individuals in coordinating, funding, and accessing needed services. Eligible individuals age three and above may obtain SSA services. More information about LCDD eligibility and services can be obtained by contacting the SSA department at 740-532-0406.

On the state level, the biennium budget bill was signed by Governor DeWine on 718/19. There were several items pertaining to County Boards of DD including a wage increase for Direct Support Providers (DSPs) of Medicaid waiver services. The budget bill sets aside funds to achieve a state average wage of \$12.82 for the second half of FY 2020 and the first half of FY 2021, and \$13.23 for the second half of FY 2020. The additional funds will come from the Ohio Department of DD along with contributions from County Boards of DD. This action was taken to help curb the high provider turnover rates in Ohio. There were several other DD related items including additional funding for Early
